FORMER BISHOP'S RESIDENCE.

Shortly after the war broke out, Mr. Langdon, of Langdon and Langdon, offered the authorities rent free the use of the house and grounds known as Broughton Hall, on the Parramatta River, at Leichhardt.

The property was acquired and the house built for Bishop Broughton, the first Anglican Bishop of Sydney. More recently it was the residence of the late Mr. John Keep. The grounds consist of an area of about 24 acres, beautifully laid out with lawns, rose-ries, hedges, fish ponds, summer houses, and in parts resembles a tropical jungle, so luxuriant is the growth. The house is solidly built, and will afford accommoda-tion for at least 60 wounded soldiers. Gas and water are laid on, and the property is within easy distance of the tram.

The Premier has received the following further offers to accommodate wounded sol-diers:--Royal North Shore Hospital, 50 beds while the war lasts; Mrs. A. E. Craig, Greenwich, accommodation for one soldier.

A movement is on foot among University women to provide a bed for our wounded soldiers in one of the military hospitals. Contributions may be sent to Miss Austin, Municipal Library, Queen Victoria Markets.

Syntax searching

Has anyone know where there may be a manual of search syntax.
For example, I like to specify a year range, to avoid all the clicks necessary to drill down on a few years.
Amazingly, what little I know of syntax shows that it is case dependent.
See below for proof of this:

SEARCH EXAMPLES:

kitchin date:[1904 TO 1904] # produces 7 answers

kitchin date:[1904 to 1904] # produces 0 answers

kitchin DATE:[1904 TO 1904] # produces 0 answers

kitchin date:[1904 TO 1904] # produces 0 answers

So "date:" must be in lower case, and "TO" must be in upper case!!!

The search syntax is described in the Trove Digitised Newspapers help page:

There are two ways to do the search you are trying to achieve above using the basic search options, and not resorting to the 'Advanced Search'.

METHOD 1

Simply type the following in the search box:

[kitchin 1904]

This will initially search for articles with both the words "kitchin" and "1904", but above the search results will be the following option:

The book, *The Climate of Courage* written by Jon Cleary was published in serial form in *The Sydney Morning Herald* (31 October 1953 to 18 December 1953).
 On 19 November 1953 SMH published this letter by Jon Cleary regarding his book:
 Novelist Replies:
 Sir, May I claim some small space to answer a flock of letters that has descended on me as the result of a paragraph in my novel "The Climate of Courage" currently running as a serial in your newspaper.
 The paragraph concerned spoke of the "uncivilised" drinking hours of Sydney, and laid part of the blame upon "wowsers." I have had too many letters to answer personally, but I feel they must be answered, since without exception every one of them is insulting. All of them are written by self-announced "wowsers" who harangue me about the disgusting behaviour of drinkers, drunkards who have no idea of manners or respect for the "finer things of life," and then go on to accuse me of being the sort of drunkard who entices his children to go on the bottle as a relief from their school homework.
 While some of my best friends are drunkards, I should like to point out in your columns that I personally am a total abstainer. Some readers do not seem to be able to separate an author from his characters.
 Since "The Climate of Courage" has other controversial points in its later episodes, let me get in early and say that my characters have minds of their own. I only work here.
