

## TE RUNANGA PUKA - NATIONAL LIBRARY OF THE COOK ISLANDS

- Is a division within the Ministry of Cultural Development (MoCD) located at the Sir Geoffrey Henry Culture Centre.
- Was established in 1992 but became fully operational in 1993 with a collection of just over 10,000 books comprising mainly of:
  - Children's Fiction and Non Fiction
  - Adult Non-Fiction
  - Reference Collection
  - Cook Islands and Pacific Books, Reports and Theses
  - A very small collection of Pacific rare books
- Has a dual function that of a National and a Public Library



## **National Library Collaboration with MoCD**

- The Ministry of Cultural Development has a total of 22 permanent staff and 4 outputs consisting of:
  - Output I: Cultural National Identity National Auditorium for events, property maintenance health safety
  - Output 2: Cultural Heritage National Museum and Anthropology Division
  - Output 3: National Records and Information National Archives and National Library
  - Output 4: Corporate Services Policy, Finance and Administration




#### **Acts Administered by the Ministry of Cultural Development:**

#### 2. Budget


- (a) A library database no longer exists to help achieve the 2<sup>nd</sup> key deliverable

## The Way Ahead for the National Library

- I. Increase the collaboration between the National Library and:
  - a) all government departments in Rarotonga
  - b) all the schools in Rarotonga
  - c) all non-government organisations in Rarotonga
  - d) international libraries and organisations
- 2. Seek for funding or assistance from international stakeholders or funding agencies
- 3. Seek for training opportunities in the required fields to help develop staff
- 4. Having a stronger network with other stakeholders
- 5. Need to be more pro-active
