

Collect works from overseas, particularly Asia and the Pacific, that enrich the Australian community's understanding of its place in the region.








Australian Web Archive (AWA)

- Collecting websites since 1996
- Largest fully text searchable web archive in the world
- Closes the 'digital documentation gap' of the last 20 years
- Will be freely accessible via Trove
- Technical, legal, policy, privacy and ethical considerations
- Robust risk assessment multiple Government agencies
- Closed release NOW
- Public release March 2019



Total web archive collections: 608 TBs and eight billion records

Domain harvests: 507 TBs
