1. INTRODUCTION

The National Library of Maldives has experienced a recent wave of development. Some of the highlights include a newly approved organization structure leading to the change of part time staff to full time staff, inauguration of a nation-wide reading campaign and relocation of the library to a new building. All these developments are indebted to our recently elected Director General who has brought forth his experience in leadership and management to the Library field in the Maldives.

In the climate of development and modernization that has prevailed since 1978 the library was named "The National Library" by His Excellency President Mr. Maumoon Abdul Gayoom on 1st June 1982. As of 2nd April 1990 the National Library functioned under the President's Office. On the 11th of November 1993 it was taken under the care of the then Ministry of Information and Culture. Several name changes took place for the Ministry. The Ministry was later renamed as the Ministry of Information and Arts and then Ministry of Legal Reform, Information and Arts. The National Library now functions under the Ministry of Tourism Arts and Culture and is headed by a Director General. This change was brought about on the 13th of November 2008 with the appointing of our new President His Excellency President Mr. Mohamed Nasheed.

The library provides Public Library Service cum National Library Service. Public Library service aims to provide information, recreation and support research as well as equal opportunity for education and books for all. National Library services aims to acquire and preserve publications concerning the country and maintain national literature. Adult collections are housed in the main building and children's services are provided at the separate Children's Multimedia Library.

2. LIBRARY LEGISLATION

The National Library under the Legal Deposit Act 1/2006 is legally obliged provide to the general public:

- I. Items published in Maldives and by Maldivians both locally and abroad
- II. Collect these items and preserve them
- III. Develop readership in society
- IV. Overlook the development of Public libraries
- V. Manage the workings of the Legal Deposit Committee

The government mandate given to the National Library includes:

- I. Collect books and other materials, and provide access to the general public, thereby creating interest and developing readership.
- II. As enacted in the Legal Deposit Act 1/2006, collect, preserve and give access to materials published in and about Maldives.
- III. Collect materials published about Maldives internationally
- IV. Collate and publish the National Bibliography
- V. Library registration and standardization
- VI. Provide expertise and training to other Libraries
- VII. Provide mobile library services throughout Maldives

4. NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN COLLECTION DEVLEOPMENT

The National Library has previously divided its collection into Reference, Academic, Fiction and Non-Fiction. Each section has a unique label and was separately arranged. During the relocation process it was decided to collate the whole collection according to subject as there were many of the same and similar books in different locations of the library.

5. NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN MANAGING COLLECTIONS

The National Library currently has Liberty3 as its Library management system software; plans are underway to upgrade the software to the latest version of Liberty 4.2.

6. NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN PROVIDING ACCESS TO COLLECTIONS

The National Library has received funds to acquire a server which will pave the way to give access to the Online Liberty3 OPAC allowing for online searching of the Library catalogue.

7. COLLABORATION

- The National library has planned are implementing the following collaborative projects
- I. Maldives Library Association: Implementing of Koha free open source software to create online catalogues ultimately leading to a Maldivian Union Catalogue.
- II. Maldivian Greenstone Network (which includes Maldives National University, Maldives Library Association, Department of Heritage, National Center for Information Technology): Establishment of a Digital Library with access to digital collections of Local magazines and newspapers.
- III. National Museum: Reading Campaign 2011-2012: Reading for Social Development where the target is creating awareness of our history, culture and heritage and the importance of information literacy.
- IV. Colleges and Institutes: Create a Memorandum of Understanding where students from these institutions can utilize the library.
- V. Department of National Planning: a statistics corner is available with print and audiovisual resources provided by the department
- VI. Ministry of Islamic Affairs: an Islamic corner is available with print resources provided by the Ministry.
