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1. General Overview

The mission of the National Library of Indonesia is to guide, develop and make the most of all kinds of libraries; to preserve references (printed and recorded) as nation's cultural achievements; and to provide library services to all. Indonesian Government has set up 11 national priority programs as stated in the National Mid Term Development Plan (RPJM Nasional) 2009-2014. The library development program belongs to the 11th program which is under the Field of "Culture, Creativity and Technological Innovation". Targets to be achieved in the library development programs are:

- a. Providing reading materials to develop reading habit and culture of the society
- b. Improving ITC based library services throughout the country
- c. Improving the quality and capacity of the library throughout the country to support lifelong education
- d. Preserving and utilizing the national intellectual works.

2. Relationship with Government and Legislations

National Library of Indonesia is a non-departmental government institution. It is responsible directly to the President of the Republic of Indonesia while in performing its operational duties, National Library of Indonesia is under the coordination of the Minister of Education and Culture. The National Library of

Indonesia' mandate is to set out in the Deposit Act No. 4 1990, Regulation No. 70 1991 and Library Act No. 43 2007.

According to the Library Act No. 43 which was issued in 2007, the National Library of Indonesia has 6 functions namely:

- a. as the library development center,
- b. as the referral center,
- c. as the deposit center,
- d. as the research library,
- e. as the preservation library
- f. as the center for library networking.

The National Library of Indonesia has obligations:

- a. to develop the library national system which will support the national education system
- b. to provide equal library services all community through out the country
- c. to develop the quality and quantity of the national collections
- d. to promote reading habit and the use of library within the community
- e. to develop the quality of librarians
- f. to acknowledge those who own and preserve manuscripts.

5. New Developments in Managing and Providing Access to Collections

1. Developing National Library and Reading Culture Platforms.
2. Revitalizing Library Services through:
 - a. Developing the e-Library Program
 - Developing closed access network to the 37 nodes representatives of 33 Provincial Libraries, 2 Presidential Libraries, 2 District Libraries
 - Distributing library block grant comprises of books, hard wares and library application program to District Libraries.
 - Developing 6 Centers of Excellence of Library Services which focusing on local content information in 6 provincial libraries in Riau, East Kalimantan, Yogyakarta, Bali, South Sulawesi and East Nusa Tenggara.
 - Developing 25 website templates for the Provincial ILbraries (<http://perpusmitra.pnri.go.id>)
 - Developing National Union Catalogue (1.592.266 records) (<http://kin.pnri.go.id>) and National Bibliography (1.196.243 records) (<http://bni.pnri.go.id>)
 - Developing Web Archiving (1097 Websites) (<http://arsipweb.pnri.go.id>)
 - Developing the Indonesian National Digital Heritage Repository (14.000 digital Objects) (<http://pdni.pnri.go.id/default.aspx>)
 - Developing Data Center and Data Recovery Center
 - b. Developing District and Village Libraries including libraries in small islands, coastal and border areas
 - Developing District Libraries.
 - Started from 2007 up to 2012 has granted 450 District Libraries out of the 467 district libraries with the collections, hardware, software and training
 - Developing Village Libraries
 - To support the national programs of community reading habit improvement and facilitating public information access, National Library of Indonesia started from 2007 up to 2012 has developed and/or supported 21.281 out of 77.967 village libraries with books related to their need,

library facilities, and technical training. The program will be continued up to 2020.

- Developing Libraries in Small Islands, Coastal and Border Regions
 - In implementing this program, National Library of Indonesia started from 2009 has supported 160 libraries in small islands/border regions and 50 libraries in coastal areas.
- a. Developing mobile and floating libraries
 - National Library of Indonesia started from 2004 has distributed 505 mobile libraries to provincial and district libraries including 7 floating libraries for 6 provinces.
- 3. Subscribing e-journal and e-books intended to be accessed by public
- 4. Finalizing National Standard for library collection, infrastructure and facility, service, human resource, organization and management.
- 5. Reading Culture and Library Promotions.
- 6. Developing Capacity Building of the Librarians.
- 7. Hunting and Conserving Manuscripts and Rare Books.
- 8. National and International Exhibitions.

6. Collaborations with Other National Institutions

National Library of Indonesia has been doing collaborations with other libraries and agencies, namely: provincial and district libraries, state and private university libraries, school libraries, some prominent special libraries. The National Library of Indonesia has also developed strong collaboration with the Ministry of Education and Culture, Ministry of Communications and Informatics, Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Law and Human Rights, Ministry of Women's Empowerment and Child Protection and other prominent agencies.

7. New Building

The National Library has planned to build a 24 story building in Jalan Medan Merdeka Selatan, Jakarta. It will be a modern and an iconic building. It is planned to be ready 2015.
