- Paper conservation, especially conservation by using Japanese traditional paper

- Five-day training program for Mr. Yadab Chandra Niraula, Chief Librarian of the Nepal National Library, and Mr. Yam Bahadur Bashyal, Section Officer, Ministry of Education, to contribute to the reconstruction of Nepal libraries after the Nepal Earthquake. (Feb. 2016)
- Four-day Training Workshop for the Preservation of Paper Cultural Heritage for two experts from the General Directorate of Antiquities and Museums, Syria, as a part of the "Silk Road Friendship Project" funded by the UNDP. (May 2018)

#### 2) Domestic cooperation

- One-day training programs on preservation and conservation of library materials (annually) During FY2015-2017, 180 people in total participated.

- Online training courses for librarians. During FY2015-2017, 714 people in total completed the course entitled Basic Theory of Preservation and Conservation. Another course, entitled Basics of Digitization, has been available online and can be started by anyone at any time.
- Dispatch of staff members to prefectural and university libraries to conduct training sessions on preservation. (annually)
- Dispatch of staff members to Kumamoto Prefectural Library to provide training in repairing materials damaged by the Kumamoto Earthquake in April 2016.
  Other than the training, the NDL repaired five severely damaged items which the Kumamoto Prefectural Library could not handle themselves.

- Being a PAC Centre helps our staff members develop their skills and knowledge. We take advantage of the network of PAC Centres when a staff member of our Preservation Division visits other countries and does research on preservation activities.

It would be greatly beneficial if the IFLA Headquarters could provide financial support to librarians in developing countries who want to take training courses at PAC Centres. We hope that the annual financial contribution of the National Diet Library for IFLA Strategic Programs will be used in a tangible way such as this.
