## How to reattach a cover to a text block

When the cover and end paper separate from the text block, we paste a hollow tube (a cylinder made of paper) to the spine to reattach the cover to the text block.




## **Materials**

- Starch paste, about the consistency of cream soup
- Adhesive mixed with starch paste at a ratio of 1:1
- ◆ Kraft paper (thick)

## **Tools**

Ruler, pencil, folder, scrap paper, cutting knife, cutting mat, glue brush for adhesive, glue brush for starch paste, dry cloth, cooking paper, press boards, weights




 Cut the kraft paper to make a rectangle of the size shown above.



3. Place the kraft paper on a sheet of scrap paper. The place another sheet of scrap

2. Fold the kraft paper in three



4. Join the two edges of the kraft paper together to form a hollow tube. Then flatten

paper on the kraft paper, as shown. Apply mixed adhesive to the kraft paper, then remove the scrap paper.



5. Apply mixed adhesive to the face of the spine.




 Attach the flattened tube to the face of the spine, taking care to align the tube to the spine.



After making sure that the tube is securely attached to the spine, apply mixed adhesive to the flattened tube. the tube into a strip



Before the adhesive on the spine dries, apply mixed adhesive to the single-thickness side of the tube.



8. Use a folder to press the flattened tube firmly onto the face of the spine.



10. Before the adhesive on the tube dries, apply mixed adhesive to the lining of the cover spine.



11. Place your left hand on the text block to hold it firmly in place, then use your right hand to close the cover so that the spine returns to its original position.



13. Use a folder to press the cover along the groove firmly into place.



15. After the adhesive dries, open the book to the first leaf and place a sheet of scrap paper over it, leaving a 5-mm gap to the gutter.



12. Cover the spine with cooking paper, then rub the spine and groove with a dry cloth to press the cover firmly in place on the text block.



14. Place the book between two press boards, and place a weight on top of the upper board until the adhesive dries.



16. Apply starch paste to the gutter gap, then remove the scrap paper.



17. True the edge of the free endpaper and the text block, holding them together with your left hand to keep them aligned.



19. Close the book slowly.



 Use a folder to press the free endpaper into the gutter. Be careful not to apply too much pressure.



20. Place the book between two press boards, and place a weight on top of the upper board until the adhesive dries.
